I provided the medical input for Hawthorne Day Hospital, an acute adult day hospital, which has up to 30 patients per day attending. In the Mental Health Liaison part, which is a deliberate self harm service, I assessed DSH patients, and signpost them to appropriate services. Part of this job also involved supervising DSH assessments by SHO's. In conjunction with the Consultant Psychiatrist I taught and supervised ECT, I was involved in gettingcare pathway. With a pharmacist, I set up an outpatient initiation of Clozapine pathway and was also involved in setting up a Clozapine clinic. The local Journal club was set up by another Consultant and I, and also involved in teaching within psychiatry locally. I attended the local Mental Health/A&E forum and the Acute care forum. I also had three patients for long term psychotherapy with Borderline Personality Disorder. |

Since migrating to the UK in 1991, I initially worked in locum posts due to other family and personal commitments. Many of these were between one and five months duration, and was through Medics Health Care Services, initially based in Scotland and then in Yorkshire.

5. Non Medical Experiences in UK

During the period from 1991 to September 1996, my husband and I owned and operated a Guest House in Aberfeldy, Scotland. This included an initial total renovation and refurbishment and we obtain Scottish Tourist Board accreditation as Highly Commanded and AA accreditation of 5Q. From this experience I obtained

some knowledge of the financial and managerial aspects of running a business. We sold the business in 1996 because we felt unable to devote enough time to family whilst maintaining a high level of service to our customers. During this time I worked in locum SHO posts in the “off season” in order to maintain my skills and knowledge.
